



Highway 104 at Antigonish NATURE TRAIL

Why is the trail being built?

The trail is being constructed to add to the existing trail system. It creates opportunities for outdoor recreation for residents, the chance to see the created wetlands and explore the landscape, river and floodplain.

Where will the trail go?

An interpretive walking trail and potential viewing platform is proposed as part of the compensation project. On the South Site, approximately 0.8 km of new trail is proposed. The trail is in a loop and brings the user into the floodplain passing between the created wetlands. On the North Site, opportunity exists to include an overlook at one of the upgraded culverts allowing trail users an opportunity to see the influences of the tidal wetland restoration project.

What will the trail have?

- Gravel surface;
- Sections of elevated walk way above wet areas;
- Control structures to control access; and
- Furniture such as benches for rest opportunities
